### ANNUAL ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

### PRISONS DEPARTMENT

Prisons Department is an integral part of the Criminal Justice System. It is also a constituent of the law and order machinery.

### **FUNCTIONS AND OBJECTIVES:-**

- A. The Primary function of the department is for the safe keeping of all the prisoners forwarded to judicial custody, whereas its objectives is to reform the prisoners and to make them law abiding individual on their release from prisons. To improve the monotonous life in jails, both indoor, outdoor games, entertainment facilities like Colour Television sets, and other musical instruments have been provided and extra curricular activities like sports and games are being held every year in the month of December.
- **B.** (i) **STRUCTURE AT THE SECRETARIAT LEVEL:** The Prisons Department is headed by the Chief Secretary at the Secretarial Level, with the Principal Secretary, The Under Secretary, Financial Adviser and the support staff.
- (ii) INSPECTORATE LEVEL: Headed by the Director General of Police (Prisons)/Inspector General of Prisons, the Assistant Inspector General of Prisons, the Finance and Accounts Officer and the support staff.

#### C. Plan and Non-Plan Allocation:

- (i) Plan: The total allocation under the State Plan Scheme is Rs.2.00 (Rupees two crore) only, out of which an amount of 1.20 has been earmarked for utilization by the Public Works Department (PWD).
- (ii) Non-Plan: The total allocation under the Non-Plan Budget is Rs.626 Lakhs and an additional sum of Rs.100 Lakhs was allotted on  $0.9 \cdot 0.3 \cdot 200$

### D. ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS:

Security measures have been tightened after the escape of 7 (seven) U.T.P's from District Jail, Shillong, on 31<sup>st</sup> May, 2009.

- 11(eleven) staff were suspended which among them included the Superintendent of Jail, the Jailor, Head Warder, Naik AB, Warders 1(one) cook was terminated from service for his complicity in the escape. 119 (one hundred nineteen) staff from the Superintendent to the rank of Medical attendants were transferred.
- 2. A Siren, silent Generator and Door Frame Metal Detectors were installed at District Jail, Shillong.
- L.P. Gas has been introduced at Shillong Jail in place of firewood, which is cost effective and environment friendly. Steps are being to replace firewood with cooking gas in all the jails.
- 4. Tenders for the installation of C.C.T.V. system at Shillong jail have been floated and awaiting government approval to enhance the surveillance and monitor the movement of staff and prisoners. This system will be introduced phase wise in all the jails.

## E. MENTION OTHER ACHIEVEMENTS, INNOVATIONS REFORMS ETC:-

N.G.O's used to visit all the Jails for counseling, imparting Yoga
 Training as well as conducting Non Formal Adult Education
 Programme for the prisoners.

- 2. Vocational training for prisoners like carpentry cane and Bamboo works, knitting etc have been introduced in the jails and the same is being imparted through instructors posted in all the jails. The finished products are sold and the revenue generated is deposited into the revenue account of the Department through Treasury Challan.
- 3. The important policies/programmes proposed for the year 2009-2010 is to complete the construction of District Jails at Nongstoin and Nongpoh and to make them operational, construction of Additional Barrack, a Hospital and to install a Water Treatment Plant at District Jail, Shillong.
