PRESS RELEASE

The North Garo Hills District Police successfully foiled an abduction attempt and rescued a businessman in a swift and coordinated operation on the afternoon of 25 April 2026.

At approximately 3:00 PM, Bajengdoba Police Station received credible information from members of the public in the Bolsong area that unidentified individuals were abducting a businessman in a silver Ertiga tourist vehicle bearing Registration No. ML-08-K-5869. Acting promptly on the information, a police team from Bajengdoba Police Station established a naka (checkpoint) at Mansinggre.

At around 3:30 PM, the suspect vehicle, along with the victim's motorcycle being ridden by one of the accused, was intercepted and stopped by the police. Upon checking the vehicle, the abducted businessman was found inside and was immediately rescued.

Preliminary enquiry revealed that three miscreants had intercepted the victim along the Bolsong-Agia road using the Ertiga vehicle. They forcibly stopped him, snatched his motorcycle key and mobile phone, demanded his trading license, and searched his person. The accused then robbed him of ₹30,000 in cash before forcibly abducting him in their vehicle. One of the accused also took control of the victim's motorcycle and followed alongside. The victim raised an alarm, prompting local villagers to alert the police.

The three accused individuals have been identified as:

1. Shri Tenggra Ch. Marak alias Togan (36 years), S/o. Shri Letingston D. Sangma, R/o. Durabanda Chambugong, P.O & P.S – Sangknigre, South Garo Hills,
2. Shri Dipon D. Sangma (38 years), S/o. Lt. Dinonath Das, R/o. Dobakkol, P.O – Dobsipara, P.S – Tura, West Garo Hills
3. Shri Lovingson R. Marak (33 years), S/o. Shri Ratul D. Sangma, R/o. Lower Dobasipara, P.S – Tura, West Garo Hills.


During questioning, Shri Tenggra Ch. Marak alias Togan claimed to be associated with an NGO named **United Garo People's Forum**.

In this connection, a case has been registered at Bajengdoba Police Station vide Case No. 03/2026 under Sections 126(2)/127(2)/135/140(3)/304(2)/3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS).

The North Garo Hills District Police reiterate its firm stance against any form of criminal activity, including those carried out under the guise of Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs). Such

actions, particularly when exploiting the prevailing situation for personal gain, will not be tolerated. Strict legal action will be taken against offenders in accordance with the law.

The general public is urged to remain vigilant and to report any information or inputs regarding such criminal activities to the nearest Police Station or the Police Control Room to enable timely intervention by law enforcement authorities.
